- 3) Concerns were expressed about the lack of planning for changes caused by retirements in the departments. Who will be hired and what will be the decisions? This topic surfaced in response to the ERIP documents that are circulating. The Mission & Goals statements from the departments that this Committee has reviewed so far have not addressed this important point at all.
- 4) Concerns were expressed about the Missions & Goals and intentions expressed in them by the various departments with no indication of the size of the department or the number of majors in those departments. Planning which includes the size of the department was recommended.
