MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF YOUNGSTOWN STATE UNIVERSITY

Tod Administration Building Friday, December 19, 2001

Pursuant to notice duly given, a regular meeting (the two hundred thirty-third) of the Board of Trustees of Youngs-town State University convened at 3:00 p.m., Friday, December 19, 2001, in the in the Board Room in Tod Administration Building.

All nine trustees were present at the meeting, to-wit: Mrs. Eugenia C. Atkinson, chairperson of the board, who presided, Mrs. Ruth Z. Wilkes, Mr. Joseph S. Nohra, Dr. Chander M. Kohli, Mr. Larry E. Esterly, Mr. Charles B. Cushwa III, Mr. F. W. Knecht III, Dr. H. S. Wang, and Mr. John L. Pogue. Also present were student trustees Ms. Mollie McGovern and Mr. Jeffrey J. Parks.

Also present were: Dr. David C. Sweet, President; Dr. Tony Atwater, Provost; Dr. G. L. Mears, Executive Vice President; Dr. Cynthia E. Anderson, Vice President - Student Affairs; Mr. Terry R. Ondreyka, Vice President - Financial Affairs, and Franklin S. Bennett, Jr., secretary to the board of trustees. Also present were approximately 45 persons, including deans, members of the faculty, students, administrators, and members of the news media.

The chairperson called the meeting to order.

ITEM I - PROOF OF NOTICE OF MEETING.

Evidence was available to establish that pursuant to Article II, Section 1, of the board's *Bylaws;* written notice of today's regular meeting was timely provided to each of the trustees, the student trustees and to the president.

ITEM II - DISPOSITION OF MINUTES FOR REGULAR MEETING HELD SEPTEMBER 28, 2001; AND SPECIAL MEETING HELD DECEMBER 4, 2001.

Prior to the meeting, the secretary had provided draft copies of the minutes of the board's regular meeting held on September 28, 2001 and special meeting held December 4, 2001 to each trustee, the student trustees, and the president. There being no additions, corrections, or revisions thereto, the minutes were approved as mailed.

ITEM III - REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY.

Dr. Sweet briefly highlighted several areas: 547 graduates received degrees at Commencement exercises held on December 16, 2001; there are currently 54 students in YSU's doctoral program; the recently-released Ohio Board of Regents Performance Report clearly illustrates that YSU is a "best buy" in higher education; YSU once again faces significant financial challenges as state support for higher education declines; the increase in the maximum amount payable to Pell grant recipients from \$3,750 to \$4,000 will result in \$500,000 in additional annual financial aid; the University will be open over the holidays to further enrollment efforts; the strategic planning process continues on a number of fronts - the board will receive a report at its March meeting, with action anticipated at its June meeting; Dr. Sweet is pleased with progress on the implementation of the Ohio State Auditor's recommendations; a revised Campus Master Plan is being developed.

ITEM IV - REPORTS OF THE COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD.

The board considered the following committee reports and recommendations:

1. Academic and Student Affairs Committee

The chairperson recognized Mrs. Wilkes, chairperson of the Academic and Student Affairs Committee who stated that the committee was recommending five resolutions for adoption by the board. On behalf of the committee, Mrs. Wilkes then moved the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolution to Authorize Conferral of Honorary Degree - Steve D. Bullock

YR 2002-24

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the conferral of a Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.) degree, honoris causa, upon Steve Bullock, with all the rights and privileges attendant thereto.

Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

The secretary to the board then read the following resolution:

Resolution Recognizing Accreditation of Programs in the Bitonte College of Health & Human Services

YR 2002-25

WHEREAS, the Dr. Dominic A. and Helen M. Bitonte College of Health and Human Services has developed programs at the associate, baccalaureate, and graduate levels to meet regional and national needs for healthcare professionals; and

WHEREAS, faculty have engaged in extensive self-study and documentation of the quality of these programs; and

WHEREAS, the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission granted initial accreditation on July 11, 2001, to the Master of Science in Nursing for the maximum five-year period; and

WHEREAS, the American Dietetic Association granted initial accreditation to the associate degree Dietetic Technician program and to the baccalaureate Didactic Program in Dietetics, as well as continuing accreditation of the Coordinated Program in Dietetics for the maximum ten-year period; and

WHEREAS, Youngstown State University has the distinction of being the only university in the country that has achieved accreditation for all three types of programs in the field of dietetics.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University, commend the Departments of Nursing and Human Ecology; department chairs, Dr. Patricia McCarthy and Mrs. Jean Hassell; the program faculty; and program directors Dr. Sharon Shipton, Mrs. Suzanne Leson, and Dr. Mohammad Shayesteh; and Dean John Yemma on this achievement; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be presented to each of the departments and individuals named in this resolution.

Mrs. Wilkes moved adoption of the resolution as read by the secretary to the board. After receiving a second from Dr. Kohli, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present.

The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

The secretary to the board then read the following resolution:

Resolution of Recognition

WHEREAS, Alpha Lambda Delta is a national society that honors academic excellence during a student's first year at college; and

WHEREAS, Alpha Lambda Delta, founded at the University of Illinois in 1924, currently has over 225 chapters across the United States and has initiated over 600,000 students; and

WHEREAS, students invited to join Alpha Lambda Delta represent the top 15 percent of college freshmen across the country; and

WHEREAS, the Youngstown State University Chapter of Alpha Lambda Delta was chartered in February of 1999; and

WHEREAS, the "Order of the Torch" Award recognizes up to five outstanding chapters in the nation, and is based on programs or activities for the chapter and/or campus community; and

WHEREAS, through its strength and extraordinary growth, the YSU Chapter was awarded the "Order of the Torch" Award on November 8, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the "Maintaining the Flame" Award was established to recognize those chapters who have won the Order of the Torch Award and continue to strive for excellence in their programs; and

WHEREAS, through persistence and continued excellence, the YSU chapter was awarded the "Maintaining the Flame" Award in 2001;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees at Youngstown State University congratulates and recognizes the officers; members; and advisor, Mrs. Virginia Mears, of the YSU Chapter of Alpha Lambda Delta for their continued excellence in the ar-

eas of academics, programming, campus visibility, and internal communication; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we commend their accomplishments and thank them for their commitment and dedication to Youngstown State University and to the community.

Mrs. Wilkes moved adoption of the resolution as read by the secretary to the board. After receiving a second from Mr. Nohra, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

The secretary to the board then read the following resolution:

Resolution Commending the Establishment Of the Master of Science in Environmental Studies

YR 2002-27

WHEREAS, there is a need in the nation, and particularly in northeast Ohio, for individuals with the knowledge, skills, and leadership to address complex environmental problems; and

WHEREAS, the faculty of Youngstown State University, under the leadership of Dr. Alan Jacobs, Director of the Center for Environmental Studies, developed a new graduate curriculum to meet this need; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Board of Regents authorized the University in July 2001, to offer a Master of Science in Environmental Studies; and

WHEREAS, the College of Arts and Sciences; the William Rayen College of Engineering and Technology; the Bitonte College of Health and Human Services; the Warren P. Williamson, Jr. College of Business Administration; and the School of Graduate Studies collaborated in the design of this interdisciplinary program; and

WHEREAS, the combined expertise of faculty from the Departments of Biological Sciences, Civil / Environmental and Chemical Engineering, Chemistry, Geology, Health Professions, and Management is utilized in program instruction and research;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University commend these five colleges and six departments for their collaboration and congratulate them on program approval by the Ohio Board of Regents; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be provided to each of the participating departments; to Dr. Alan Jacobs, Program Director; and to Dean Peter Kasvinsky.

Mrs. Wilkes moved adoption of the Resolution as read by the secretary to the board. After receiving a second from Mr. Cushwa, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

The secretary to the board then read the following resolution:

Resolution Commending the University
On Accreditation Action by
The Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association

YR 2002-28

WHEREAS, the North Central Association requested that the University report by July 1, 2001, on the progress made in implementing a new general education program and on the progress made in improving the representation of minorities among the faculty, staff, and student body; and

WHEREAS, the faculty, led by the General Education Committee, and the General Education Coordinator, Dr. William Jenkins, worked diligently to implement an innovative, new general education program in Fall 2000; and

WHEREAS, a University/Community Task Force developed a Diversity Plan of Action, and the University created a University Diversity Council, led by Mr. Robert Faulkner; and

WHEREAS, the required progress reports documenting the University's efforts were authored by Dr. William Jenkins and Dr. Janice Elias, with the assistance of the Office of Equal Opportunity and the Office of Institutional Research; and

WHEREAS, The Higher Learning Commission found that "the general education curriculum is well conceived;" and

WHEREAS, The Higher Learning Commission stated that "The positive direction of minority faculty, staff, and student representation at the University shows progress;" and

WHEREAS, no further progress reports are required by The Higher Learning Commission;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees at Youngstown State University commends the faculty and staff on the progress made in general education and in creating a campus climate that promotes diversity; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be provided to the Office of Equal Opportunity, the Office of Institutional Research, and to Dr. Jenkins, Dr. Elias, and Mr. Faulkner.

Mrs. Wilkes moved adoption of the Resolution as read by the secretary to the board. After receiving a second from Mr. Knecht, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

2. External Relations Committee

The chairperson recognized Mr. Esterly, chairperson of the External Relations Committee who stated that the committee was recommending one resolution for adoption by the board. On behalf of the committee, he then moved the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolution to Accept Development Gifts

YR 2002-29

WHEREAS, Board policy provides that the President shall compile a list of gifts to the University for each meeting of the Board of Trustees and present the list accompanied by his recommendation for action by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the President has reported that the gifts as listed in Exhibit A attached hereto are being held pending acceptance and he recommends their acceptance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees does hereby accept these gifts on behalf of Youngstown State University and requests that the President acknowledge the acceptance of these gifts and express our gratitude for their generosity in support of the University.

Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

3. Finance and Facilities Committee.

The chairperson recognized Mrs. Donna Esterly, Executive Director - Computing/Information Services, who described the efforts of the 28-member YSU website advisory committee. Mrs. Esterly distributed an executive summary of the website redesign (a copy of the summary is attached to these minutes following the Exhibits). Mrs. Esterly provided a Power Point presentation of the newly designed website. Mrs. Esterly recognized and thanked the members of the website redesign steering committee.

The chairperson recognized Mr. Ondreyka who provided a status update on the following matters: The annual audit has been completed by the University's outside auditors and has been forwarded to the Office of the Ohio State Auditor, the University again received an unqualified opinion from the external auditor; the University is in compliance with all Senate Bill 6 ratio reporting requirements; the University will receive a onetime revenue benefit of approximately \$1 million as a result of the conversion from the quarters to semesters; future financial statements will change substantially due to GASB pronouncements 34 & 35; an emergency student loan fund has been established and is available to assist any undergraduate or graduate student without financial circumstances, to academic standing, full/part-time status (Mr. Ondreyka distributed a one-page "Tuition and Fees Update, a copy of which is attached to these minutes following the Exhibits).

The chairperson recognized Mr. Nohra, chairperson of the Finance and Facilities Committee, who stated that the Finance and Facilities Committee was recommending one resolution for adoption by the Board. On behalf of the committee, Mr. Nohra then moved for adoption of the following resolution:

Resolution to Authorize
Purchase of Properties for Campus Improvement

YR 2002-30

WHEREAS, Youngstown State University has identified an area surrounding the campus within which it seeks to acquire property for the benefit of the University; and

WHEREAS, the property located on the east side of Audubon Street, known as Youngstown City Lot No. 14271, n. pt. (Home Savings and Loan property), is needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the properties located on the south side of Emerald Street, known as Youngstown City Lot Nos. 16351, 16353, and 16354 (Tokich properties), are needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the property located on the north side of Emerald Street, known as Youngstown City Lot No. 16370 (Hanni property), is needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the properties located on the east side of Walnut Street adjacent to Harrison Field, known as Youngstown City Lot No. 4585 (both parcels) (Cassese properties), and Youngstown City Lot No. 4586, mid. pt. (Worrellia property), are needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the properties located on the north side of Court Street and on the west side of Harrison Street adjacent to Harrison Field, known as Youngstown City Lot No. 19824, w. pt. (Askew property), Youngstown City Lot No. 19824, e. pt. (Gangone property), Youngstown City Lot No. 19826 (Tillman property), Youngstown City Lot Nos. 19828 and 19829 (Caizza properties), and Youngstown City Lot Nos. 19830, 19831, 19832 and 19833 (Mendenhall/Kemp properties), are needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the properties located on the north side of Willard Street, known as Youngstown City Lot No. 9034, w. pt. (Mendenhall property), and Youngstown City Lot No. 9035, e. pt. (Mendenhall/Kemp property), are needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the property located on the south side of Scott Street, known as Youngstown City Lot No. 4605, w. pt. (Woodberry property), is needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the properties located on the north side of Grant Street and the adjacent lot located on the south

side of Scott Street, known as Youngstown City Lot Nos. 997 and 4610 (Huffman properties), are needed for campus improvement; and

WHEREAS, the properties located on the south side of Arlington Street, known as Youngstown City Lot Nos. 4656 and 4657 (Pavelko properties), are needed for campus improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the purchase of the properties as described subject to a satisfactory title search and environmental assessment.

Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

4. Internal Affairs Committee.

The chairperson recognized Dr. Kohli, chairperson of the Internal Affairs Committee, who stated that the committee was recommending two resolutions for adoption by the board. On behalf of the committee, he then moved for adoption of the following resolution:

Resolution to Ratify Faculty Staff Appointments

YR 2002-31

WHEREAS, the *Policies of the Board of Trustees* direct the President to appoint such employees as are necessary to effectively carry out the operation of the University; and

WHEREAS, new appointments have been made subsequent to the September 28, 2001, meeting of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, such appointments are in accordance with the 2001-2002 Budget and with the University policy on Equal Employment Opportunity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby ratify and confirm the appointments as listed in Exhibit B attached hereto.

Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

The secretary to the board then read aloud the following resolution:

Resolution of Appreciation

WHEREAS, the Youngstown State University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics has had many outstanding performances during the Fall 2001 athletic season; and

WHEREAS, the YSU football team set a school record with 11 student-athletes earning all-conference accolades, with tailback P.J. Mays selected as the Gateway Football Conference's Offensive Player of the Year, and Mays, Pat Crummey, LeVar Green, Bruce Hightower and Jerald Burley earned first-team conference honors; and

WHEREAS, offensive tackle Pat Crummey earned first-team All-American honors from the Sports Network, the AFCA and The Associated Press, while defensive back LeVar Green earned first-team All-American honors from the Sports Network and second-team accolades from the Associated Press; and

WHEREAS, volleyball player Kristen Meech had a 4.0 grade point average and is the first YSU student-athlete to earn Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-American honors, being chosen to the third team; and

WHEREAS, football student-athletes Antulio Aroche and Mike Thomas were named Verizon/CoSIDA Academic first-team all-district; and

WHEREAS, Mike Thomas was a first-team Academic All-Gateway Football Conference pick, joined by second-team pick Antulio Aroche and Honorable-Mention selections Bob Sivik and Dave Tesniarz; and

WHEREAS, football student-athlete LeVar Greene was one of sixteen players who was nominated for the Buck Buchanan Award, honoring Division I-AA's top defensive player; and

WHEREAS, women's cross country freshman Emily Schnitkey earned the title as Horizon League Newcomer of the Year and was a first-team all-conference member, while also being named the All-Ohio Freshman of the Year; and

WHEREAS, many student-athletes had standout performances and were honored as players of the week, including P.J. Mays as the Gateway Offensive Player of the Week three times; Bruce Hightower, LeVar Greene and Antulio Aroche earned defensive honors during the season; Andre Coleman and Jerald Burley earned Special Teams Player-of-the-Week honors; and offensive guard Nick Roberts earned league offensive lineman-of-the-week. Greene and Burley were named as a National Player of the Week during the season. YSU diver Brandi Goettsch was the Horizon League Athlete of the Week, and women's basketball player Jen Perugini was named the Horizon League Player of the Week; and

WHEREAS, the fans of Stambaugh Stadium ranked tenth in average attendance and third in total attendance out of 122 Division I-AA schools, and ahead of thirteen Division I schools, once again proving the Penguins have the best fans in the nation; and

WHEREAS, student-athletes served in leadership positions as team captains, including Dave Tesniarz, Jeff Ryan, Bruce Hightower, Bob Sivik and LeVar Greene for football; Lauren Roseman and Jessica Tait for soccer; Kristen Meech, Melissa Lyczkowski and Rebecca Sylak for volleyball; Will Edwards, Tony Orcena, and Kurt Michaelis for men's cross country; and Lindsay Frontz, Courtney Houck and Melissa Ruffner for women's cross country;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees at Youngstown State University congratulates the entire YSU Department of Intercollegiate Athletics under the direction of Executive Director Ron Strollo, and its student-athletes on their success; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that individual copies of this Resolution be presented to the Executive Director, his entire staff, and all YSU Fall 2001 student-athletes.

Dr. Kohli moved the adoption of the resolution read by the secretary to the board. Mrs. Wilkes seconded the motion. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all trustees present. The chairperson declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

YSU Web Site Redesign www.ysu.edu

The Web Site Advisory Committee was established to coordinate and oversee the redesign of the YSU web site and to serve in an advisory capacity to the Web Site Manager in designing and upgrading the site. Additional information, including membership of the Advisory Committee can be found at www.ysu.edu/webadv.html. A Steering Committee comprised of several members of the Advisory Committee was also formed to establish priorities and assist with the details throughout the redesign process.

The following issues were taken into account throughout the overall redesign process:

- Accessibility (page load time, browser access, ADA Compliance, text based version);
- Design Guidelines (common and Mac equivalent fonts, non-frames or text equivalent page for frames, 800x600 pixel screen resolution);
- Focus on navigational design and ease of locating information.

The focus of the overall redesign process was to reorganize the departmental Web sites and information currently existing on the university wide Web site and to redesign the home page, top-level pages and secondary level pages to create a more uniform, effective, and consistent site.

The new home page has been designed to accommodate access to information based both on content and audience. Rollover subcategories have been included within the content categories to allow direct access to a particular subcategory and to provide a general sense of information available within each category. New navigational paths for Prospective Students, Current Students, Faculty and Staff, and Alumni & Friends have also been added to the site to assist visitors, students, faculty/staff, and alumni in finding information quickly. Two additional new features include an Apply Now button and a Contact Us button, which will provide potential students with direct access to apply to the University and the ability to direct inquiries to the appropriate area. Another new feature that has been added to home page is the news scroll bar, which highlights specific news items occurring on campus. The capability to click on a particular news items to access more information allows individuals to read more detailed information associated with a particular story.

A text only version has also been made available on the home site to accommodate non-graphical access and reader accessibility. Rotating photographs highlight campus activities and campus life at Youngstown State University, and will be routinely updated to reflect constant changes to the home page. After a period of testing and review of feedback provided on the redesigned web site, the new YSU web site will replace the old site in January 2002.

TUITION & FEES UPDATE FOR SPRING 2002

Due to recent budgetary actions taken by the State of Ohio which resulted in a 6% decrease in state funding, the Board of Trustees has reluctantly approved a mid-year tuition increase for all Youngstown State University students.

The tuition increase approved by the Board of Trustees on December 4, 2001 and effective for the 2002 Spring Semester is reflected on the enclosed Statement of Account.

The University is aware of the financial impact that this tuition increase will have on our students and will attempt to assist students to make the necessary arrangements to meet their financial obligations.

Any student who finds that the increase in fees will cause an undue financial hardship is encouraged to come in person to the Office of Financial Aid & Scholarships, Meshel Hall, prior to their payment due date, to determine if they may be eligible for a short-term emergency loan for Spring 2002. The emergency loan will be:

- available to any undergraduate or graduate student registered for the Spring 2002 semester without regard to financial circumstances, academic standing, or full- or part-time status
- available up to the maximum of the tuition increase
- available without application fee or interest charges
- due upon the last billing due date of the term, April 5, 2002

In those instances where a student has experienced undue hardship or exceptional circumstances, the Office of Financial Aid and the Bursar's Office will work individually with that student to identify additional aid or to grant extended payment arrangements.

Example -

A full-time, undergraduate, resident student who paid \$2174 in tuition fees for Fall 2001, would be assessed \$2294 in tuition fees for Spring 2002. This student would be eligible for an emergency loan up to \$120 which is the amount of the mid-year increase.
