Thank you for your kind letter which arrived the day I mailed the first 185 pages of the manuscript back to you. The first three chapters should therefore reach you any day, if they have not been delivered before this letter arrives in Budapest.

Enclosed with the three chapters you will find comments of both specific and generat nature. The subsequent chapters will follow in weekly intervals.

As you will see from the material I sent to you the first chapter is corrected in detail. This meant that almost every sentence had to be reworked and in many cases whole paragraphs needed retranslation. This is such time consuming work that it would take a professional translator several months to finish the manuscript. Furthermore I know that this was not your intent when you sent me the manuscript. I will make all corrections of obviously incorrect sections, will read all the notes and make comments designed to make this book acceptable to an English speaking and reading audience.

Unfortunately I can not devote the same amount of time to subsequent chapters as I had to the first. The immense number of hours necessary to go through the whole manuscript and practically, retranslate the pages is just not available. The health of my wife has again turned to worse and she will have to undergo surgery at the end of November. This plus the burdens of teaching, administration and research make it impossible for me to do the type of job which would result in a perfect manuscript.

I think, however, that we will be able to work out a satisfactory solution. As you can see from the material I have sent back, I am going through the material with great care and am indicating where changes should be made. It might be a good idea to have the translator and possibly another person well versed in English, look over the notes, make the necessary corrections and clear up questioned portions of the manuscript.

Since I feel most unhappy that I can not perform my duty as Lector to the fullest, I naturally will do the work gratis. I feel very badly about the whole matter. This is the first instance in my life that I undertook a task and did not complete it to my own satisfaction. Upon reading the manuscript last winter, I should have sent it back to you with the request that a better translation should be made before it is sent to me. This would have made a lot of difference. I foolishly and optomisticly believed that I would be able to do the retranslation. In retrospect this looks rather thoughtless!

You will receive the next two chapters in about a week with all the corrections. I will also write a summary of my impressions concerning the book of Professor Mezey.

Dear Mr. Gabor:

This coming week I will be able to return to you the corrected proofs of the first chapter of the Mezey manuscript. This constitutes roughly 84 pages including footnotes.

It is with greatest regret that I have to apologize for keeping the manuscript so long but a number of unforseen and tragic circumstances have prevented me from reading it sooner. Shortly after I wrote to you in April my wife, who was pregnant, was rushed to the hospital and after complications lost the child we were expecting this summer. Her recovery was slow and this naturally placed a heavy burden on me during most of the summer. Now, however, all indications point to a speedy completion of the reading of the manuscript.

The reading of Professor Mezey's book is an extremely time consuming and difficult task. As I have already indicated to you the translating into English is full of errors and completely misleading of the original text. There is hardly a sentence which can be left in the original form, in fact my work has almost been a retranslation of the original manuscript. This not meant as an excuse forreading the manuscript but is meant only to acquaint you with the immensity of the job. The translator of the Mezey manuscript should not be condemned exceedingly for her many mistakes because of the difficulty of the subject matter. The translator in this case would have to be familiar with Ancient and Medieval history, literature, culture in order to be able to make meaningful translation.

If the translation as it was prepared would be printed you would have a major disaster on your hands and the prestige and reknown of the academic press would suffer a tremendous blow. Please do not interpret this as praise for my work but rather a sincere desire to see the publication of a volume which would bring only positive response from the English speaking scholarly world. I, therefore, ask you to please continue to have patience for a few more weeks and I will send you the chapters as I finish the revisions. Having had editorial experience myself I realize that you are anxious to get this volume printed and on the market, but I feel at the same time that a little more patience will result in the prevention of a major catastrophe.

I hope that writing in English does not cause you major inconvenience fand naturally I will look forward to your reply in Hungarian. With best wishes I remain

The bibliographical sketch is enclosed. I hope that it will be sufficient for the introductory remarks you have to make.

My paper will conform to the rules set down by the Forum as far as length is concerned. It will be between 12 and 15 pages and should be 25 minutes long when delivered.

I am at present working on the paper and will submit two final copies to you around September 25.

The problem that I am treating is the influence of ecclesiastical patronage on the Hungarian Renaissance. In most western European countries a strong middle class took an active role in the promotion of the Renaissance. Hungary lacked this class for the most part and therefore the influence of the ecclesiastics was of major importance. The social background of a number of important fifteenth century prelates will be examined. The main theme of the paper will be that the lack of an intellectually and financially active middle class left a vacuum and this lacuna was filled by the activities of the educated, affluent, humanistic oriented clergy. Beside the royal court of Matthias Corvinus it was at the ecclesiastical courts that the Renaissance found its most important supporters.

I will be very happy to see you again at the conference in November and hopefully, we can spend some time in getting acquainted better.
