

Something very interesting popped up concerning your Letter of Evaluation dated the 24th November. Consequently, it is now of great urgency and importance to have your letter translated as is into Hungarian and on your official letterhead. In short, we need the same letter but in Hungarian. If this can be done, it will certainly help expedite progress.

No doubt you must have kept a copy of your letter for your files. If so, I would be very grateful to you if you would kindly rewrite your original letter in Hungarian and send it on to me as soon as you can. It is needed to help open up negotiations with the Hungarian government for a film production on a co-production basis with a top-flight film producer (American) even though we have yet to come up with the finished manuscript for "The Raven and the Ring". Incidentally, my associate, John Eckenrod, is already over in Europe to do further research work and I will be going over later to Rome and to Budapest. In addition, Dr. William L. Mayo of Governors State University, with whom I am closely associated in the work of the American Society for Environmental Education, is helping us to find a major publishing house for the book aspects of the project, for he has done a great deal of work with several of them and is personally acquainted with their top management.

Our objective now is to bring this project to a conclusion during the New Year, and, accordingly, I am readjusting my regular work schedule to make this possible.



Dear Dr. Domonkos:

It was a real pleasure to receive your encouraging letter of the 19th June, 1975. I am looking forward to meeting with you personally just as soon as our synopsis of "The Raven and the Ring" story will be completed. It stands to reason, however, that, while this preliminary endeavor has to be based upon secondary sources under the circumstances, the finished work will have to be based upon primary sources for the most part.

I enjoyed reading the material you kindly sent me and found each very interesting, indeed.

No, unfortunately, I do not have the Forster and Moller volumes you mentioned as sources for a true replica of the Hunyadi coat-of-arms. Please let me explain what I have in mind: I need an 8 X 10, glossy, black and white print of the Hunyadi coat-of-arms that I can use to illustrate the cover of the synopsis. I could use other pertinent prints for inclusion in the body of the work and such as, for example, Hunyadi himself, his castle, etc. In short, any and all prints helpful to illustrate the story would be very useful at this time. You see, what I plan to do once the synopsis will be carefully edited is to have it actually printed and bound as a booklet and so that it will make a good impression when submitted to some of the sources we have in mind. So, if you could provide us with some pertinent prints, it would certainly be appreciated and returned to you after use.

Your notations on the material sent stimulated a great deal of interest on my part to obtain a sample copy of each publication mentioned and, in particular, a copy of the Canadian-American Review of Hungarian Studies which I believe can prove to be of great importance later on.

I would like to thank you for your response to the IREX questionnaire of last April. Your conscientious return of the questionnaire contributed to a remarkable response rate of nearly ninety percent, exceptional in such a survey.

Two preliminary computer runs of the data, as well as a brief preliminary report by Professors Denitch and Kadushin of the Bureau of Applied Social Research, have indicated that the survey is providing just the sort of information we had hoped it would; already, early results point to strengths and weaknesses of the exchanges, and suggest areas for policy examination.






Dear Professor Domonkos:

Cher et éminent Collègue,

A l'approche de la Nouvelle Année, je me permets de vous présenter, au nom de tous les membres du Centre de Recherches de la Renaissance de Budapest et au mien, mes vœux de bonheur et de succès pour 1976. Nous espérons vivement pouvoir compter, à l'avenir aussi, sur votre collaboration précieuse et sur votre intérêt à l'égard de nos travaux. Je saisis cette occasion pour vous dire quelques mots de nos activités en 1975.

Au cours de cette année les publications du Centre se sont enrichies de plusieurs ouvrages importants. Avec un certain retard, enfin vient de paraître le volume comprenant les communications du colloque organisé par notre Centre en 1972, à Pécs, à l'occasion du 600^e anniversaire de la mort de Janus Pannonius /Janus Pannonius, Tanulmányok, recueil d'études dirigé par Tibor Kardos et Sándor V.-Kovács/. Une partie des communications sont déjà parues en langues française, italienne ou allemande, dans les numéros 3-4 de la revue Acta Litteraria Academiae Scientiarum Hungaricae, le présent volume, cependant, publié entièrement en langue hongroise, embrasse toute la matière du colloque, ainsi que quelques contributions plus récentes. - De même, cette année nous avons fait paraître, - tome 2 de la collection "Studia Humanitatis" - les communications présentées à une autre réunion internationale remarquable, le Deuxième Colloque hungaro-vénitien sur la Renaissance qui a eu lieu en 1973 /Rapporti veneto-ungheresi all'epoca del Rinascimento, a cura di Tibor Klaniczay/. - Nous avons édité le tome 5 de notre collection Humanisme et Réforme: Szeged reneszánsz-kori műveltsége, /La civilisation de Szeged à l'époque de la Renaissance/ par M. Sándor Bálint, ainsi que le tome IX de la série intitulée Bibliotheca Hungarica Antiqua présentant des éditions fac-similé d'imprimés hongrois du XVI^e siècle. Ce dernier reproduit un imprimé de 1566, dit Várad i énekeskönyv /Le livre de cantiques de Várad/ dont un seul exemplaire est parvenu jusqu'à nous.


Notre colloque traditionnel avait lieu cette année du 16 au 22 mai à Mátrafüred, dans la Maison de repos de l'Académie hongroise. Cette fois le thème des séances n'a pas porté sur la Renaissance hongroise, mais un thème plus général a été choisi: "La poétique et la théorie de l'art de la Renaissance". Plus d'une centaine de professeurs, chercheurs et étudiants ont participé à ce colloque où 23 communications ont été présentées et discutées. En dehors de ce colloque, nos séances mensuelles ont suivi leur cours habituel. Lors d'une séance nous avons eu le plaisir d'avoir pour conférencier un collègue tchécoslovaque, le Professeur Jan Martínek /Prague/.

Parmi nos "travaux en équipe" je tiens à souligner avant tout la réalisation de l'ouvrage de synthèse sur la Renaissance en 4 tomes, entrepris sous l'égide de l'Association Internationale de Littérature Comparée. Grâce à nos éminents collaborateurs travaillant dans les pays les plus divers, de nombreux chapitres ont été terminés au cours de cette année, ce qui veut dire que le tome premier sera achevé dans un proche avenir.

Plusieurs chercheurs de notre Centre avaient l'occasion, tout comme auparavant, de mener des recherches dans des bibliothèques à l'étranger. D'entre les voyages d'études c'est le séjour de 3 mois de M. Béla Varjas en République Fédérale d'Allemagne qui s'est révélé le plus réussi: il y a découvert plusieurs oeuvres de grande importance, et jusqu'ici inconnues de la littérature hongroise du XVI^e siècle. Nos collaborateurs étaient présents aux différents colloques internationaux qui avaient lieu dans le courant de l'année. Au mois de janvier, MM B. Keserü, T. Klaniczay, A. Pirnát, B. Varjas ont participé - présentant des communications - au colloque international organisé par le Zentralinstitut für Literaturgeschichte /Berlin/ de l'Académie de la RDA consacré aux problèmes de la Renaissance et de la Réforme, MM. Tibor Komlovszki et Imre Varga ont pris part au colloque organisé par l'Académie polonaise sur les relations européennes de la littérature polonaise ancienne. MM. Istvan Bitskey et József Kormányos se sont rendus à Tours, au Colloque d'été du C.E.S.R. Au congrès de la Fédération Internationale des Sociétés et des Instituts pour l'Étude de la Renaissance qui s'est réuni à San Francisco c'est moi-même qui ai représenté notre Institut. Mais le colloque où le plus grand nombre de spécialistes hongrois ont représenté les études en cours sur la Renaissance chez nous, s'est déroulé du 8 au 11 novembre à Narni /Galeotto Marzio e l'umanesimo italiano ed europeo/. Grâce à l'hospitalité du Centro di Studi Storici di Narni, nous étions six /MM. V. Gyenis, T. Klaniczay, P. Kulcsár, Z. Nagy, Mme A. Ritóók-Szalay, M. L. Szörényi/ à présenter des communications du côté hongrois sur l'oeuvre de Galeotto Marzio qui avait joué un si grand rôle en Hongrie.

Je saisis cette occasion de vous informer du changement qui aura lieu dans la direction du Centre à partir du début de l'année à venir. Comme je suis chargé de diriger, dès cette année scolaire - pour une durée de quelques années -, la Chaire de lettres hongroises à l'Université de Rome, je passerai plus de temps à Rome qu'à Budapest. Je serai toujours en contact avec mes collègues hongrois et lors de mes séjours fréquents et prolongés à Budapest, je continuerai à prendre une part active à la direction des activités du Centre, et tout particulièrement en ce qui concerne les relations internationales. Mais pour des raisons d'ordre administratif, je me vois obligé de partager la direction effective du Centre avec mon collègue et ami, M. Béla Varjas. Les lettres envoyées à mon adresse du Centre de Budapest, me parviendront en tous cas, mais dès que possible, je vous ferai savoir mon adresse personnelle à Rome.

Au nom de mes collègues et au mien, je réitère encore mes voeux de bonheur et de réussite pour la Nouvelle Année et je vous prie de croire, cher et éminent Collègue, à l'assurance de mes sentiments de fidèle sympathie.

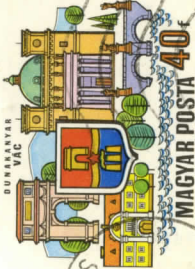

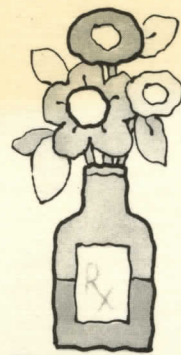
