Dear Professor Molnar:

The American Association for the Study of Hungarian History had its annual business meeting a few days ago here in Cincinnati. A significant portion of the meeting was devoted to a discussion of our contribution to the publication of the Hungarian Studies Newsletter. In December, 1986 the AASHH agreed to lend support to the HSN, with the understanding that the project would be evaluated after a two year period. In the discussion at our recent meeting many members expressed their disappointment at the slow pace of publication. Members of the editorial board told of the frustrations they experienced in trying to arrange for timely publication of the material they had collected and edited. Indeed, the members of the editorial board stated that they were resigning their positions. After the discussion it was decided that the AASHH should sever its relationship to the HSN and that I, as president, should inform you of this decision.

I am sorry that our collaboration did not work out as we had hoped. Certainly we all hope that the HSN will continue to appear under other auspices.






In addition, you are required to provide IREX with two copies of any book or article that results from your grant.

We will look into the possibility of sending postcard reminders every year or so over, say, a five- to ten-year period. If you already have books or articles resulting from your IREX sojourn, we would appreciate receiving copies without delay. (If you have already been kind enough to send copies of your publications, please ignore this request).

While we are responding to an outside requirement, we believe that this system of acknowledgments and of building a library of grantees' writings will be a powerful factor in encouraging our donors to continue their support for the exchange programs, and hope that you will lend your full cooperation.


Enclosed you will find some information of our Commission. The further practical organisation of the Congress is done by the Sienese Colleagues.

Hopefully you have received my letters of February 4, 1988 and February 22.

I had your Good Report on the Congress of Madrid to be held in 1990 on my desk.

a) You requested our per littera votes on the candidates for Ireland, Finland and Switzerland. Naturally Professor Ulrich Im Hof is well known, my Computer was "bursting of his publications" I sent them to Dr. Domonkos, my Delegate to the meeting of Siena. As far as the other two candidates: Helas the Computer did not come out with anything. This was the reason, I did not answer immediately. In your communiqué you wrote: if no answer "votre réponse est affirmative." But in case doubts were raised from other representatives, I would like to instruct my delegate Dr. L.S. Domonkos to abstain as far as the confirmation is concerned. If all are FOR (all!!!!) then my vote is also FOR.

b) The misunderstanding about the election of the Hungarian delegate Professor Dr. George Székely. Your Procès-Verbal had the sentence "A. Gabriel s'informerá auprès de M. Székely". I repeat again, WE DID ELECT HIM DEPENDING UPON HIS CONSENT AND ACCEPTANCE. If I am wrong, please inform me.

I regret very much that I will not be able to attend the Bologna Congress, but I want to thank you for the magnificent pictorial book Università e studenti a Bologna. The beautiful color reproductions consoled me for the very imperfect and tendentious Bibliography pp.39-49 probably from Carlo Dolcini pen.

Reading this imperfect and unscholarly Bibliography one may suspect that what has been mentioned by Gabriele Zanella in 1976 would not be repeated; ~~was~~ therefore no mention of the important publications of Cardinal Ehrle would be understood. But the "author?" mentioned the well known Cencetti study, Studium fuit Bononie, 1966; Kuttner, 1972;-- P. Torelli, 1935; Coing, 1973 listed by Zanella p.56, no.310-Haskins, 1929!!! but nowhere could I find Celestino Piana O.F.M. Il "Liber Secretus Iuris Caesarei" dell'Università di Bologna 1451-1500, Milano, 1984, pp.444 large octavo.

Another remark, re:p.50. The Bologna Statutes of 1317-1347 conserved at Presburgo in Hungarian Pozsony was brought back from Bologna by a Hungarian Student, which should have been mentioned if someone refers to Bratislava, a name never used till the unjust treaty of Trianon in 1920.

I read with great pleasure the section of the statutes of ca. 1252 discovered by our colleague Domenico Maffei.

To sum up. Thank you for the volume. I am writing the Publishing company Utet to compliment them on this typographically perfect work. No thanks will go or compliment to the "author?" of the Bibliography.


PUBLICATIONS

Dear President Humphrey:

During the 1987-1988 academic year, I was on a Faculty Improvement Leave from my teaching duties in the Department of History. As a recipient of a Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Grant as well as a fellowship from the International Research and Exchange Board, I spent four months in Europe, primarily in Budapest, Hungary.

The Fulbright Grant enabled me to travel to Hungary in order to gather materials for my research project on the cultural history of medieval Budapest. During the four months in the Hungarian capital, I was the official guest of the Historical Museum of the City of Budapest, as well as the Institute for Historical Research of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. Administrators and colleagues at both institutions welcomed me with great enthusiasm, did their utmost to aid and facilitate my research. The environment for scholarly work was ideal. As a result, I was able to gather an immense amount of primary and secondary source material. Furthermore, I had the opportunity to visit a number of excavation and reconstruction sites in and around the capital. It was also possible for me to purchase a large number of valuable books, including some rare eighteenth-century editions, which will be most helpful when I write the monograph summarizing my findings. This book is provisionally entitled: "An Intellectual and Artistic History of Medieval Buda and Pest, 1241-1526." The editor of the series East European Monographs, distributed by Columbia University Press, has already shown an active interest in publishing the volume.

While in Budapest, I was received by the Hungarian Minister of Culture, Dr. B. Kopeczi, who a few years ago was a guest of our History Department and delivered a lecture for our students. He still remembers Youngstown State University with fondness and pleasant memories. I also had the opportunity to finalize publication plans with the Press of the Academy of Sciences for my forthcoming book on the Hungarian Renaissance.





There's no point in changing everything before submission and then having to change again afterwards, perhaps even changing back to the previous version.

If you would like to have a copyeditor read the monograph and make queries and suggestions at this point, I can suggest an excellent copy editor who may be willing to freelance. She was the best editorial assistant we ever had at the American Historical Review and specialized in Central European History. Her name and address:

In your last letter you seem to be somewhat bothered by hindsight, rethinking your priorities in life. Do you really think I will tell you what to do about this situation you created? No way in hell!!! because then you AGAIN could blame ME for your poor judgements, and consequences. Yes you certainly put our relationship in great jeopardy and I really don't know if I can forgive you for it! Perhaps fate will turn things sometime in the future but for now my heart is completely shattered.

My emotions are very intense and full of anxieties about the future and yes outright pessimistic about the outlook... How could I be espec-

ted to feel otherwise? All this is due to our divergent views on what priorities should be in life!

Granted, you made a commitment to IREX & FULBRIGHT by signing a contract for the duration and this took on greater importance for you than your obligation to me and to your family from the standpoint of health and well-being. You know how you stand in that and if all hell breaks loose who will be expected to pick up the pieces? Even our Florida vacation is contingent upon your ability to teach in the summer. Under the given circumstances is it any wonder I have fears and trepidations? How am I supposed to find the strength to cope with all that I have weighing me down. I should keep working till we pay our debts? That will NEVER

be the case ... and you know it! ...
because there will always be
expenses for cars, house, kids'
futures etc....

I've been evaluating my life, ...
where I've been and where I'm
going, what I've liked and what
I've hated; what I've tolerated
and what I never again will!
... of all people you should be able
to relate to this process because
you've been through this a few
times yourself ... each time I was
there for you and listened and
tried to encourage you ... and
where are you when I need you?
When is the last time you asked me
what I really want, what could you
do to make me happy? For a long
long time all you have done is
fight over everything with me

until you get your way or threaten
to leave or tell me that I am
sending you to your grave.
Is this a loving, sharing
relationship? Don't you realize
this behavior is NOT endearing
but builds up resentments?
Do you TRULY love me? ... or
just as long as I'm willing to
back you on your plans? Your
actions and words to me mean
either joy or total devastation
because I do love you but that
love needs nourishing to keep it
alive! The tender words in your
last letter are helpful but also
make me feel that now that you
are gone they flow so much
easier for you and that dilutes
their meaning. I'm still here and

you are there and nothing short of tragedy could change that until the 4 months ~~are~~ up.

I lash out at you not because I want to hurt you but only in response to being hurt and feeling slighted in so many ways and in recent years so often. I know you are scared that your health will falter in the near future and want to do all you can before that happens. In the process however, you seem to have given no thought to my well-being. Just because I do not have physical heart disease doesn't mean that I'm stronger than you or healthier than you! My love for you and my loving you has been the cause of

those many major surgeries that I went through and they have certainly taken their toll on me both physically and emotionally. How much more can I take?

Your condition is fragile and I know that I must stay strong, for you will need me to take care of you. Because I love you, I'll stand by you as I always have but I do wonder what the quality of my own life will be. If I'm left without you, I've gotten a good sampling of what that will be like during these last several weeks as well... Maybe I am too pessimistic in my outlook but the writing is on the wall and I don't like the direction it is foretelling. I too have desires and hopes to achieve but my

life seems always to be spent
in serving others, which used
to give a sense of satisfaction
but has lost its appeal for me.
Don't think that in all this nega-
tivism I've forgotten all the lovely
times, the happiness we've shared
or the things which we have

We have lived together for a quarter of a century and neither of us knows how much longer we have left. God willing when you come home, let's sit down and really talk things out WITHOUT hot tempers. Let's set priorities that we can BOTH live with to regain the quality of life and love together that we seem to have lost over the years!

I certainly do not want to end up like so many of your contemporaries having their marriages fall apart due to long separations because of their careers. I'm sure that this had a major bearing on their lives too! (I'm thinking of Dick, Bob, Lozan etc....) When you said "you needed to get away from family responsibilities and this unstimulating town"... that statement coupled with "...now don't be jealous that we will be spending a lot of time with E..." are what precipitated the supremely deep hurt that festers in me! My unhappiness has affected the kids because there are times when I just can't hold back the tears. They just feel so helpless and I'm sure are afraid what all this

will mean to them. I try to re-
assure them that you and I will
try to work things out, at least
I hope we will. They need your
assurance as well so please write
to each of them soon. Cröpi is sad
also because Rich will be gone most
of the summer. Banni is disturbed
because he still hasn't heard
anything from Columbus (it has
only been 1 wk. since his initial
