Thank you so much for your kind letter of December 19, 2003 - it has apparently been lost in the mail for a year; Professor Janos M. Bak has recently forwarded it to me.

Please find enclosed a copy of my recent contribution on Medieval Glosses in MS Munich, Bayerische Staatsbibliothek, Clm. 6211 - it has just come out in the Acta Mediaevalia of the Catholic University of Lublin in Poland. I am sending this copy to you with great respect.

On March 23, 2004, I have successfully (magna cum laude) defended my doctoral dissertation on Latin Classics in Medieval Hungary: Eleventh Century and at the graduation ceremony on June 17 I have solemnly been declared a doctor.

The Hungarian Scientific Research Fund provided me with a postdoctoral teaching position at the University of Budapest for the 2004/2005 academic year: I am teaching seminars on Medieval Latin (four classes a week, an hour and a half each - which counts as a rather heavy teaching load by local standards).

I am now at the stage of turning my doctoral dissertation into a book: it will be published in English as a separate volume in the series Agatha of the Department of Classics at the University of Debrecen in Hungary. The New York office of Central European University Press will also be distributing the book so it already does have the Library of Congress Cataloging-in-Publication Data. The book will be out at the beginning of 2005.

I am sorry to have missed the chance of meeting you while I was a dissertation fellow in the Erasmus Institute at the University of Notre Dame, but I do hope to meet you some time in the future. Until then, I remain


